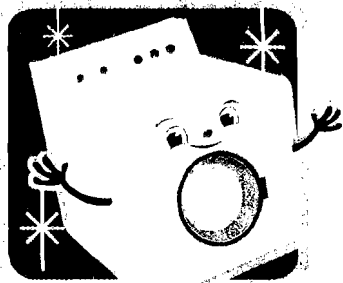

Life Experiences: Life experiences like scams, unsolicited phone calls and offers received in the mail were discussed. If you do business over the internet or make purchases over the internet, one credit card should be used. If solicited over the phone, within the first 10 seconds, ask the caller to identify his or herself and the reason for calling. Know who you're giving your check to and absolutely under no circumstances should your social security number be given out over the telephone.

Reverse Mortgages: Mr. Seeley does not advise his clients to obtain reverse mortgages. Homeowners being solicited for reverse mortgages should be extremely cautious. Don't be afraid to have a professional look into any important decision before signing any documents. A reverse mortgage is primarily taking cash out of your house and paying interest on the money taken. Please remember that is not an interest free loan. To qualify for a reverse mortgage you have to be 62 yrs., your home has to be your primary residence and it has to be debt free. There are currently two well-known reverse mortgage programs on the market; namely, House Keeper from Fanny Mae and a federally insured loan. With a reverse mortgage, the homeowner is still responsible for insurance, taxes and the upkeep of the home.

You need to consider cash flow from now going forward. At the time of closing of a reverse mortgage, the money is handed to you in three different ways: (a) through a credit line for which you pay for only what you use, (b) a lump sum cash payment and (c) a monthly cash advance. The upside to this is yes, you get money, but there are lots of downsides. Reverse mortgages are not endorsed by AARP.

COMMUNITY SAFETY INFO: Every resident needs an **Emergency Plan** in the event of an emergency. Emergencies can be tornadoes, hurricanes, blackouts, etc. Know your home's vulnerability to storm surge, flooding and wind. Locate a safe room in your home for each hazard. Determine escape routes from your home and places to meet.

Have an out-of-state friend as a family contact so your family members have a single point of contact. Check your insurance coverage - flood damage is not usually covered by homeowners insurance. Stock non-perishable emergency supplies, a **Disaster Supply Kit** and a **NOAA weather radio**. **Be prepared.**

YOUTH REPORT: The after-school programs are winding down and the summer camps will start July 2 and end Aug. 17. The Elementary Camp hours are 8AM-5PM; Teens from 9AM-5PM. Teen trips include both **Hershey and Dorney Parks**, leaving at 7AM each trip day. - ◆ Candidates must compete in the required written examination and pass other screening procedures, including a background investigation.
- ◆ Candidates must be at least 17 years of age and have not reached their 35th birthday on the date of the written exam; provided, however, that time spent on military duty or on terminal leave, not exceeding a total of six years, shall be subtracted from the age of any applicant who passed their 35th birthday as provided in subdivision 10-a of Section 243 of the New York State Military Law.
- ◆ No college education is required to take the examination, however, one year (32 credits) of college education is required for appointment. Those candidates who have not attained that level of education but are otherwise eligible for appointment will remain on the eligible list and will become eligible for appointment after they have obtained the necessary college credits. Please note: several Village Police Departments require only a High School Diploma for appointment.
- ◆ Candidates must meet the physical and medical standards that apply at the time of the test. Candidates must be able to perform the essential functions of the job.
- ◆ Candidates must hold a valid New York State Driver's License at time of appointment.
- ◆ Candidates must be legal residents of Nassau County, Suffolk County, Westchester County, or one of the five boroughs of New York City at time of appointment and maintain residency in these areas.
- ◆ Candidates must be citizens of the United States at time of appointment.
- ◆ Appointments are determined on an individual basis by the Nassau County Civil Service Commission.
